Ramp Update

It has been a big month on the ramp construction project! As outlined at the update to the club on 21st October, five tender responses were received. Because of confidentiality and governance requirements, it is not possible to share full details of those responses at this stage, but the headline message is that the Club expects to be able to construct ramp in the first half of 2023. Cost has increased though and fundraising therefore remains critical.

We expect to advise the successful tenderer in the next two weeks (and we will then be able to share more of the details). Detailed design will be available around 4 weeks after that.

Currently it is expected that construction should last around 6 weeks and access to row will be available throughout, if with some restrictions.

Exciting times – the ramp is getting closer!

Fundraising Update


The additional amount added to our total last month was \$1004 made up of some surplus funds from grants etc as noted in the end of year report, as well as sales of jam etc.

The preliminary planning for the ramp project has been completed and tenders have been called for its construction. A meeting was held on site between the committee and interested contractors who have expressed interest in submitting tenders for its construction.

A group of nine members launched the octuple for a successful row, proving that it is possible to launch a large boat at low tide with care on the limited space on Frank's beach. All members enjoyed fine and sunny conditions on the river.

- Jobs to be done at least twice in the month, some may require more than that.

- The safety audit is conducted monthly by a club member and a member of the Exec Committee reviewing the various items on the Rowing Queensland safety audit checklist. The Exec Committee member will bring the checklist.
